"Whose Streets? Our Streets!:" New York City, 1980-2000 Film- producer, editor

Interviewed more than a dozen subjects, produced and edited this 18-minute short film about the work of 37 independent photojournalists who covered New Yorkers who rioted, marched and demonstrated in the streets from 1980-2000 on issues including, race relations, police brutality, AIDS, queer activism, reproductive rights and housing, among others. The film was first screened at the 2018 Fringe Festival, an annual arts and culture festival in Rochester, and in 2019 at Current Seen, an art festival in Rochester.

"Whose Streets? Our Streets!" www.whosestreets.photo - website design, production

Produced an interactive website to accompany the traveling gallery exhibition, "Whose Streets? Our Streets!:" New York City, 1980-2000. I designed, coded and produced the site, as well as filmed interviews and edited all video content for the website. The site covers 9 chosen social issues facing New Yorkers in the 1980s and 1990s and the 37 photojournalists who covered protests and demonstrations at that time. Writing by Tamar W. Shot and edited two short documentaries at the summer games about the new efforts by the Special Olympics to be more inclusive for non-intellectually disabled people, called Unified Sports. Co-Shot and co-edited a short documentary about the changing role of women athletes in Special Olympics. The story features Loretta Claiborne, a life-long and world-class athlete and global speaker, who has competed in Special Olympics since the late 1960s.

Public Education Documentary Film – Currently in production. Co-producing, filming and editing with Jenn Poggi

For many decades there has been discussion about improving public education outcomes in Rochester. As part of these discussions, the high rate of poverty in the community, economic and racial segregation, inequity in resources, the lack of a diverse teaching population, institutional bias and the quality of education are frequently discussed. This film will help to unpack the complicated story of education in Rochester. Against the backdrop of the current political discussion in Rochester, massive and unexpected budget cuts facing the school district and a sudden change in district leadership, the film will offer insight from the perspective of those impacted most - the students, their families, educators and other stakeholders.

We have been filming two high school students, Elsie Vazquez and Sintral Jones, since they were in the seventh grade. They are now both Sophomores at East High School which, in a unique partnership with the University of Rochester's School of Education, has moved its graduation rate from 19% to 70% in less than 8 years. The school's superintendent, Shaun Nelms, is trying to keep that positive trajectory of success amidst a new reality of a significant reduction of its budget as a result of a financial mismanagement under a previous administration and the COVID-19 pandemic.
